The following is an excerpt from “The Academic Code at Brown University” :

Academic achievement is ordinarily evaluated on the basis of work that a student produces independently. Infringement of the Academic Code entails penalties ranging from reprimand to suspension, dismissal or expulsion from the University. A student's name on any exercise is regarded as assurance that that exercise is the result of the student's own thoughts and study. Where collaboration is authorized, students should be very clear as to which parts of any assignment must be performed independently.

In writing examination and quizzes, the student is required to respond entirely on the basis of his or her own memory and capacity, without any assistance whatsoever except such as is specifically authorized by the instructor.

Cheating on examinations and quizzes can take at least the following forms: using another individual to take an examination in one's place; bringing into the exam room unauthorized materials from which one gains unfair assistance; improper collaboration or unauthorized assistance on take-home examinations.
